Dear Mr. King:

This is in response to your letter of January 18, 2008. The information I previously conveyed to you was accurate. If you wish to ask the Supreme Court to revisit its existing Rules and policies in this area, you need to prepare and file an appropriate application. The Court has the final say on whether access should be given to data that are otherwise confidential.

The application should be a verified petition in numbered paragraph form. Please present your requests with specificity and list any arguments you may care to make in support of your request for relief. (Please note, however, that the previous sentence should not be read as an invitation for you to renew any arguments that would rely on an alleged applicability of OPRA to the New Jersey Judiciary.)

You will need to submit an original plus ten copies. The format of your application may somewhat relaxed. You must, however, double-space the pages and use a font that is at least as large as New Courier. There is no filing fee.

The matter will be considered by the Court in due course. You will be apprised of the outcome in writing. If the Court acts favorably on any portion of your application, we will advise you what data are covered by its determination.
